Pupil Premium

The progress of all children is closely monitored. The Pupil Premium is allocated on the basis of children who are looked after by the Local Authority, children of military parents, adopted from care or who are entitled to free school meals. Where our monitoring process indicates that these children would benefit from additional support then funding will be allocated to provide an appropriate intervention strategy. Alternatively funding will be allocated to provide additional learning support within the class setting.

Funding for the year 2015/16 was 17,160, the year 2016-17 was £25,080 and in 2017-2018 will be £24,340. We have used, and will continue to use this in a variety of ways to fund the 13 eligible children;

- Small group tuition for Maths, English and reading
- Employment of an extra year 6 Maths specialist for delivering and coordinating interventions.
- Increase of computing resources
- Enable children to take part in extra -curricular clubs
- To fund students to take part in residential curriculum field trips.
- Additional hours of Teaching Assistant support
- Funded maths professional development of staff to work with identified pupils
- Provision of daily milk allocation

Funding 2015 – 2016

The impact of this funding was:

KS2 SAT's

- Reading 50% achieved the expected standard and 25% achieved at greater depth
- Writing 100% achieved the expected standard and 25% achieved at greater depth
- Maths 75% achieved the expected standard and 25% achieved at greater depth.

Year 3-5

- Reading 86% made expected progress and 14% made accelerated progress
- Writing 86% made expected progress and 42% made accelerated progress
- Maths 70% made expected progress and 14% made accelerated progress

Year 1-2

All children apart from one child, who is on the SEND register, made at least expected progress in reading, writing and maths. Two children who had taken part in our reading recovery programme made accelerated progress in reading.

The impact of this funding was:

KS2 SAT's

- Reading 80% achieved the expected standard (73% non PP)
- Writing 60% achieved the expected standard
- Maths 40% achieved the expected standard and 20% achieved at greater depth.

Year 1-5

- Reading 69% made at least expected progress and 54% made accelerated progress
- Writing 69% made expected progress and 44% made accelerated progress
- Maths 54% made expected progress and 38% made accelerated progress
