

Expressive Arts and Design:

- Take part in simple pretend play, using an object to represent something else even though they are not similar.
- Begin to develop complex stories using small world equipment like animal sets, dolls and dolls houses etc.
- Make imaginative and complex 'small worlds' with blocks and construction kits, such as a city with different buildings and a park.
- Explore colour and colour mixing.

Understanding the World:

- Show interest in different occupations.
- Continue to develop positive attitudes about the differences between people.
- Talk about members of their immediate family and community.
- Name and describe people who are familiar to them.

Personal, Social and Emotional Development:

- Forming good relationships with peers and adults.
- Creating and following class rules and boundaries.
- Showing confidence when talking to others.
- Start to understand different feelings.

Communication and Language:

- Ask questions and understand instructions.
- Use a wider range of vocabulary.
- Follow instructions and ask questions.
- Engage in story times.
- Sing songs and rhymes.

Maths:

- Recognise, describe and create repeated patterns.
- Numbers to 5 including counting, ordering, writing, recalling one more and one less, making different amounts.
- Understand the conservation of number.
- Understand numbers to 3.
- Start to use 1:1 correspondence when counting.

Physical Development:

- Move in a range of ways and negotiate space.
- Be increasingly independent in meeting their own needs e.g. brushing teeth, going to the toilet.
- Develop fine motor skills e.g. pencil hold and scissors.

Literacy:

- Recognising phase 2 Letters and Sounds phonemes.
- Reading and writing CVC words.
- Listening to and making different sounds following Phase 1 Letters and Sounds.
- Understanding the 5 key concepts of English print.
